


This half term in year 5, we will be reading The Snowman by Raymond Briggs.

 The Maya people also used more advanced farming methods, such as irrigation and terracing, to help produce food. The Maya people built sewer systems and there was even running water in the wealthiest people's homes. 	
· Historians remain uncertain why the Maya civilisation ended but agree that a significant factor was probably drought.
