EYFS news

The week got off to great start. Even though we were a day short, the children have covered all the learning needed for this week. The children have been learning about celebrations that use fireworks. They heard the story of the Gunpowder Plot and learnt the rhyme 'Remember, remember the 5th of November, gunpowder, treason and plot.' They have also learnt about the Hindu festival of Divali which is being celebrated now. They heard the story of Rama and Sita and learnt how Hindus use light and fireworks to celebrate this important celebration. Maths work has focussed on flat shapes and the children have been able to talk clearly and confidently about the properties of circles, triangles and squares. They have been on a shape hunt around school, finding shapes in the environment and created pictures using shapes.

We spent some time on Thursday talking with the class and answering questions from the children about the wasps at forest school. We have offered reassurance and explained what will happen next (pest control will be visiting next week to remove the wasps) The children all appeared to feel more positive about returning to forest school and when we do return we will of course handle this with sensitivity.
