The reception class have had a very busy week including a visit to the theatre which they thoroughly enjoyed, and Forest School (the weather was kind for once)!. The maths focus this week has been on measuring and comparing long and short, and tall and short, and ordering objects from longest to shortest and shortest to tallest. We read the story of 'Titch', 'I Can Only Draw Worms' and 'Jim and the Beanstalk,' which are all stories on the theme of tall and short or measuring. Something very exciting happened on Thursday with the discovery of a tiny little door in the wall of the classroom. The children are excited to find out why it is there and who uses it!

Pre school children have enjoyed maths themed stories this week as well as they focused on positional language in their learning. They have read 'Where's Spot?', Everyone Hide from Wibbly Pig' and Where Oh Where is Rosie's Chick?'. During rhyme time they have been singing and learning about 'Incy Wincy Spider'.
