EYFS news

In reception this week, the children have been enjoying the story of 'The Naughty Bus'. They have created story maps, sung the song and thought of alternative words to 'naughty' because we don't use that word in school. Maths work has focussed on 'time,' sequencing the week, the day and the activity. They have enjoyed stories such as 'Night Monkey, Day Monkey', 'Mr Wolf's Week' and 'Five Minutes Peace'. The children have enjoyed taking part in British Science Week with activities related to 'Change and Adapt'. They played 'camouflage caterpillars', did under the sea yoga, visited the huge tractor that came to school on Thursday and talked about how the bus in the story could 'adapt' for the different places it visits.
